
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### Introduction

The ICGE-24 Conference on Gender Equality, held in Ghana, served as a significant platform for advancing gender equality in developing economies. A total of **47 responses** were collected, offering valuable perspectives on the conference experience.

The aim of the report is to assess participants' experiences and identify actionable areas for improvement, ensuring future conferences are more impactful and address the needs of all attendees. The data collected provides actionable insights to ensure future conferences continue to be inclusive, educational, and impactful.

## 1. Participant Demographics



47 responses




A higher proportion of participants were female, showcasing strong representation in gender equality-focused initiatives.



47 responses




- Participants highlighted Panel Discussions and Keynote Speeches as the most enjoyable aspects of the conference.

47 responses




**Academic Presentations and Technical Presentations:** These were highly rated for their depth and relevance, showcasing the intellectual impact of the conference.

47 responses




- Content of Sessions: A majority rated the session content as Excellent, indicating the relevance and quality of topics covered.

47 responses




**Inclusivity and Respect for Diversity:** Feedback reflects that the conference was perceived as inclusive and respectful.

## 8. Recommendation Likelihood


How likely are you to recommend this conference to others?

47 responses




**Recommendation Likelihood:** High likelihood of recommending the conference to others, signifying participant endorsement.


How effective were communications?



The majority of attendees rated communication as "Excellent," with minimal "Good," or "Fair," responses. This indicates strong satisfaction in this area.

How would you rate your accommodation? (For travelling participants)

The chart shows the ratings of accommodations:

- **Good (46.8%)**: Nearly half rated it positively.
- **Excellent (34%)**: A significant portion found it outstanding.
- **Fair (14.9%)**: Some felt it was average.
- **Poor (4.3%)**: Few were dissatisfied.

The "Fair" and "Poor" ratings highlight opportunities for improvement, possibly in specific aspects such as cleanliness, facilities, or comfort, to enhance future participant experiences.

## 9. Feedback Comments

- Participants expressed high satisfaction and appreciation with the conference organization and overall impact. Positive mentions underscored the conference's inclusivity, professionalism, and effectiveness.
- Constructive feedback included calls to improve time management and increase interactive session formats, highlighting areas for future enhancement.

## 10. Suggestions for Improvement

*Common themes included:*

- **Time Management:** A need for better scheduling and adherence to allocated times for presentations.
- **Extended Duration:** Requests for a longer conference (three days) to explore topics in more depth.
- **Diverse Perspectives:** Suggestions to include a broader range of viewpoints and disciplines.

## 11. Actionable Recommendations

1. **Improve Time Management:** Implement stricter scheduling protocols and appoint timekeepers to ensure sessions stay on track.
2. **Increase Duration:** Expand the conference to three days, allowing deeper dives into complex topics and more networking opportunities.
3. **Enhance Session Interactivity:** Include more interactive workshops, breakout sessions, and panel discussions to foster greater engagement.
4. **Broaden Reach:** Develop targeted outreach strategies to attract participants from more countries, increasing the conference's international presence.
5. **Incorporate Diverse Perspectives:** Invite speakers and participants from varied disciplines and backgrounds to enrich discussions.

## 12. CONCLUSION

The conference effectively achieved its goals of promoting gender equality, engaging participants, and providing high-quality sessions. However, areas such as time management, session diversity, and conference duration require attention to enhance future iterations.
